# **Program**

Tanya McCready-DeBruin of Winterdance Dogsled Tours presented via Zoom from her home in Eagle Lake, Ontario, Canada. Tanya and her husband Hank run a husky dogsledding tour company that operates out of the Haliburton Highlands, Canada alongside Algonquin Park. Their husky teams will take tourists on a breathtaking tour along trails in the serene wilderness. They welcome over 2000 guests each winter. Visit their website: www.winterdance.com.

In September 1999 they quit their jobs and moved to the wilderness. They built the dog kennel first and lived in that until they finished building their home. Their first child was born before the house was completed. Hank decided in March 2010 that he wanted to participate in the Alaskan Iditarod Trail Sled Dog Race. The family of six and the team of dogs took off for Alaska. Hank had been training for a "Vision and a Dream". There were 83 teams on the lake at the start of the race. There were two veterinarians on the trail, but no medical doctor for the sled drivers. Hank had one incident where he and the dogs had to sleep outdoors overnight as he went on alone and missed meeting up with other sled drivers. Tanya said Hank trained for every possible condition and took excellent care of his team of dogs.
