Board Meeting Results:

President Gilges said that we have almost 400 flags this year and that we are close to netting \$30,000 from this project. The charitable request committee and the board approved a request to help remove the current surface and put a new sand surface in the 4-H Horse Barn at the county fair for the youth involved in showing and competing with their horses. The board also decided to charge expenses associated with fundraisers to the foundation budget. They are also looking at creating a 2nd tier of membership with lower amount of dues for younger members – that will hopefully attract them to join our club. The paperwork has been completed for the Global Grant for the Uganda Nutrition Program. Our club will do programs for Elmira Sunrise, Rush, Newark & Penn Yan Rotary clubs; as they are interested in partnering with us for this grant.

Dues are currently coming due – the invoices were handed out today. Be sure to get your payment in before June 30th.

The Camp Onseyawa Golf Tournament is June 13th. Let's hope they raise lots of money for the camp!

Adeline Rudolph reminded members that there is a Democratic primary vote coming up. Early voting

Program – Mark Sheppard introduced Holly Kelly, daughter of our member Jodi Wilbur. Holly works for Omni Services in Victor. She's been involved in industrial sales for 15 years. Omni Services is a family owned business that has been in business for 50 years and currently have 200 employees. Omni specializes in providing fluid conveyance solutions to customers near and far. They operate several locations throughout the United States. They are a distributor for hose & fitting products; including hydraulic hose & industrial hose, formed tubing, instrumentation products, specialty fluid transfer components and rubber products. They are currently working on doubling the size of their Victor facility – adding 100,000 square feet to the building. John Deere Company is one of their customers. They are an OEM (Original Equipment Manufacturer) and have five divisions. The Victor plant is their Liquid Cooling Division. Liquid cooling is required to run AI (Artificial Intelligence) chips. The Victor location is nearing 100 million in sales for this year. There are currently two types of cooling – Single Phase that is glycol based and a newer Two Phase using refrigerant. Holly mentioned that they are currently interviewing for additional staff members because they are so busy.
