Program

John Dobies, a retired DEC investigator, and Andy McNeal, a retired Monroe County Sheriff's crime scene investigator, talked of their new careers with L-Tron. They showed us the OSC360 system. The system is used for documenting various scenes ranging from code violations, biological threats to involved homicide scene investigations. The system includes a 360° spherical capture kit camera and software. They work with their clients for crime scene investigations, fire service, emergency management planning, active shooter training, forensic science, environmental safety and more. The camera captures a 360° photo in under 4 seconds, along with GPS coordinates. The images can be combined with Word documents, videos, graphs, GPS pings, etc. The completed images can be used as evidence to present at court trials.

There were several questions from our group, as it was a very interesting presentation.
