AG Jim Crane introduced District Governor **Janet Tenreiro**. The RI Theme this year is “Serve to Change Lives”. President Shekhar Mehta from Calcutta, India calls himself the “Shaker” and Rotarians the “Movers”. He also says “Service is the rent I pay for the space I occupy on earth.”

Shekhar has these service points for his year:

– Each One, Bring One. If each member brings one person to a Rotary event or meeting we could increase worldwide membership by over a million persons.

– Grow More Do More. The more our membership grows, the bigger the projects we can tackle. The Great Lakes Watershed Cleanup is such a project that our District was part of in April 2021.

– Empower Girls. In many parts of the world girls are at a big disadvantage. Shekhar's wish is for Rotarians to change the lives of girls.

DG Tenreiro is not planning on big changes during her year. She plans to support and strengthen clubs and will continue projects and committees that PDG Linda Kohl started. Janet hopes clubs will keep hybrid meetings going so that people who can't make meetings can still participate.

Last year we gave over \$20,000 to the RI Foundation. Janet encourages all members and clubs to do service projects, stretch a little and take on bigger projects. Work with another club on a bigger project. The biggest gift we are given is the power to touch a life.
