Dedicated to serving women in all stages of pregnancy and early motherhood, we provide healing and unconditional love in a comfortable home and caring communal environment that nurtures an empowered spirit and a healthy lifestyle. For each of our mothers, we create a self-directed action plan along with the structure and resources to enable the achievement of personal, educational, and professional goals that can lead to independence for a woman and her family.

Mission: provide pregnant women in need access to a caring and self-sustaining home environment, and training, in employable & entrepreneurial skills.

Objectives: Expand services to homeless, pregnant women and their children in the Rochester region. Connect moms to education to enhance their career potential, marketable skills including soft-skills necessary for job or business environments. Utilize a program model that conducts experiential job training in partnership with employers to increase skill levels, job readiness and career pathways. Provide access to entrepreneurial skills and experiences for moms to know how to thrive and work in small business environments, making them marketable to local small businesses.

Organization Goal: To prepare women to create a stable home environment, pursue a successful career and obtain financial sustainability in a growth industry in the Rochester, NY region.
