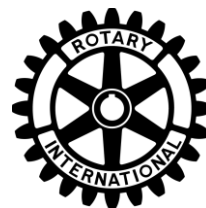

Polio Plus Society – **Janet Tenreiro, PDG** talked about giving \$100 per year until polio is eradicated. If you're interested in joining, see Janet. Tom Mees said that when Rotary got involved trying to eradicate polio there were 350,000 cases worldwide. In 2023 there were 2023. This year there are 54 cases so far.

Kim & Janet Tenreiro were part of “Whose Line is it Anyway” production at Kodak Theatre. **Cat Barnum** was happy to report that her grandmother, who had polio as an infant, is now 102 years old.

Paul Harris Presentation: **Tom Rogers, PDG** reported that our club has 13 major donors and 2 members in the Arch Klumpf Society and that our club (and members) has given \$699,994 over the years. He urged members today to donate \$3 – the cost of administering a single polio vaccine. That should put us over the \$700,000 mark!
