Today's Program:

Russ Kenyon, Esq. – Estate Planning

Russ discussed the process involved in creating a will. Over the years, he has been able to break down the planning into just two simple things:

- Your property
- Your body and its care

Decisions are made with regard to your property and your body – before you die and after you die. The shortest discussion is regarding plans for your body after you die. The longest and most important conversation is what to do with your body while you're still alive. You should have a health care proxy for when you are not able to participate in a conversation regarding your care – alternates are also a good idea. You should also have a living will and a power of attorney.

There was a very good Q&A following the program.

Russ is available to discuss any elder law, estate planning questions you may have after the meeting at Kenyon and Kenyon.
