Program (part 1): Marty Potter – Club Goals

As incoming President (as of July 1), Marty is collaborating with Nancy Stelnyk and Kim Tenreiro to chart a course for the club over the next three years. A re-vamped volunteer committee selection form will be coming soon, and it is critical that members place themselves on as many as possible. The club is dependent on fundraising efforts to do good in our community and projects cannot happen without volunteers. Feedback from club members is critical and the question was asked whether people are content with meetings as formatted or would like to see a change, possibly to every other week with guest speakers interspersed with social meetings or service projects. Also, is the format of the meeting itself something to be made more flexible. Additionally, what kinds of service projects are preferred. Are large, multi-year commitments what we want to be known for or should we focus on smaller ones. How do we improve club visibility? Ideas, suggestions, questions, etc., can be made to Marty, Nancy, or Kim and discussion will occur at the upcoming Club Assembly.

Program (part 2): Clark Kurtz – Website Upgrade For several reasons a team has been working to migrate our website functions to a new platform. The new platform provides more online security and better functionality on phones and tablet computers. Also, there are District resources available to help with technical issues that might arise. The new format has added functionality. There is an area for Rotary International generated content, more robust photo publishing features on the home page, ability to link to Facebook, speaker links, event calendar, and Zoom link access among other features. Non-members will still be able to access generic component such as the Peal but will be blocked from confidential content. Members will be able to access a 'Member Area' where personal profiles can be maintained, and customized mailing lists can be defined and utilized. The new platform also matches with overall District-wide website design. Full functionality will be an ongoing process, but basic migration has been accomplished with a few minor issues still to be resolved. Anticipated cutover to the new format is anticipated to occur in a 1-2 month time frame.
