Today's Program:

District Governor Ralph Brandt: “Imagine Rotary”

DG Brandt began by sharing the vision of Jennifer Jones, 2022-'23 President of Rotary International and discussing the meaning of this year's Rotary logo created by an Australian artist. The circle in aboriginal culture signifies our connections to one another. The dots around it represent people and there are seven because of Rotary's areas of focus. The circle and the dots together become a navigation star – our guiding light. The solid line underneath is a digging stick and it is used when doing hard work. And, since Rotary members are people of action – it represents a tool for getting things done. The colors, white, green, and purple represent peace, environment, and polio – they are also the colors of the women's movement.

He applauded the three strong women admitted into the Duarte, California Club in 1976 and the key roles women play in today's Rotary clubs.

He reminded us all that “Rotary needs to adapt to attract.”

Gareth Evans: Glacier Lakes District Scouting Report

Gareth shared an overview of Canandaigua troops: three troops and one crew are currently serving 54 scouts. That's a current market share of 5.7% as compared to the national average of 12.4%. After sharing current struggles and recruitment activities, Gareth asked fellow Rotarians for help in the following areas:
