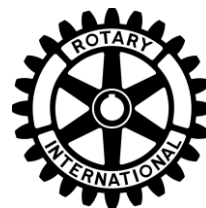

I See You Award – President Kim presented this weeks award to Janet Tenreiro for her many behind the scenes work for Kim and the entire club.

Program: Bernie Kois of Canandaigua Trout Unlimited talked to us about projects along the Cohocton River that they are involved in. Trout Unlimited is a national organization that was founded in 1959 in Grayling, Michigan. The national group has 300,000 members and has an annual budget of 83.3 million members. The local unit started in 1989 and they have 190 members from the Walworth area to the Bath area. They have three main objectives: Conserve, Educate & Instruct. They partner with both the Ontario and Steuben county soil & water conservation departments. They have planted over 8000 trees along streams to create shade for the streams and river. They have worked to restore "hung culverts" along the waterway so that the fish can continue their voyages along the waterway. They "bury" tree limbs streamside to create a "cover" so that small fish are protected from eagles & osprey from above. They do a program called Trout in a Classroom where they give an aquarium to area schools with fish for them to raise – hoping to foster a new generation of advocates for the enrironment. They have two instructional classes for any age – Fly Fishing School and Fly Tying Class. They stock fish in 20 spots along the Cohocton River 4 times in the spring. Each year they have "trash days" where they clean out the river finding tires, bicycles, etc. Their next event is the CLTU (Canandaigua Lake Trout Unlimited) summer picnic & One Fly Contest being held June 7th at Hess Park in Avoca from 7 – 2.
