- **Tom Rogers** said we had 20 tickets left for the meat raffle. Hopefully most of those were sold before the end of the meeting.

<u>Program</u> – Jenny Goodemote and her staff (Mary Ferris, Katie Smith, & Alexis Lawrence) from Wood Library brought us up to date on all the happenings going on at the library. Some stats Jenny shared (based on the past year) where:

- Library visitors increased by 30% to almost 84,000
- There are 10,804 library cardholders
- Digital library cards increased 17%
- Checkouts up by 33% to almost 210,000
- # of programs up 97% to 1805
- Books downloaded up 16% to almost 58,000
- Computer Sessions up 14% to 8,654
- Wi-Fi usage up 64% to 7,241

Each of the speakers shared information about the numerous programs and classes offered through the library, which are too many to mention in this short space. Clearly the library offers a variety of opportunities for those in our community to participate in no matter your age. Jenny shared information on the library's strategic plan, where the library receives their funding from, what their expenses are, and the communitybased funding for 2023. The library is asking for a \$75,000 increase this year, a 1.8 cents/\$1000 of assessed property value - \$2.74 for a \$150,000 home. If the increase is approved, the library will still have a need to raise an additional \$357,850 through their own fundraising efforts. Jenny also provided information on the Reading Garden, a capital project the library plans to break ground on this fall.
