Allison gave a short tutorial on Venmo – a part of PayPal used for paying bills, charging lunch, dues, making donations to The Foundation and a host of other useful items. It's an app you add to your phone, and set up a bank account to fund your purchases. It keeps you

from having to carry cash with you. If you use a bank account instead of a credit card, it saves you a 3% transaction fee. You can set your privacy settings so that people can see what you are buying and how much you paid for it, or you can keep your business completely to yourself. Allison says that in her age bracket, Venmo is like Social Media and banking put together!

Marty Potter then went to the computer and brought up MyRotary.org. It's the main website for Rotary International, and she was able to walk us through an amazing amount of information in a very short time. There is a wealth of information if you are willing to take the time to explore. You can donate to The Foundation, you can take courses in The Learning Center, you can download brands and logos from the Brand Center. 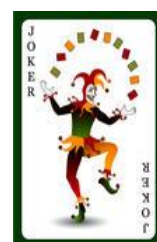
