Program

Tina Rossman from the Partnership for Ontario presented on the Ontario County Youth Court. Youth Court was established in 2000 by Deb Holland, who is one of our club's Paul Harris Awardees. Youth Court is made up of students ages 12-17 and they currently have 120 members, but only 60 are active currently. Students take an Oath of Confidentiality and must attend 20 hours of training covering topics of: Public Speaking, Restoration Justice, Court System & Roles in Court, and Community Service. There are currently five court sites in our county. The court gets its referrals from Sheriff's Office, School Resource Officers, and local courts. Individuals appearing in court go through a pre-court interview. Court is currently being run via Zoom. The Youth Court members fill the roles of Bailiff, Judge, Prosecution, Defense and Jury. Sanctions imposed by the Youth Court include taking online or written courses and community service obligations. Youth Court has proven to be a deterrent to recidivism.

The meeting closed with **Rick Hawks** leading the attendees in the reciting of the Four Way Test.
