Program:

The Canandaigua Airport - Bob Mincer, Airport Manager

The Canandaigua Airport has been on Brickyard Road for over 70 years and is a non-commercial facility, on 284 acres, including a 5,500' runway. The airport is heavily supported by FAA and New York State grants.

Who uses the airport:

- Flight schools and clubs
- Utility surveyors
- Private charters
- Business travel
- Government use
- Medical emergencies/transport
- Agricultural survey and treatment

Plans for 2021 include adding:

New Terminal that will house a Conference Room, Pilot School, Kitchen, Observation Deck, Pilot Rest Area/Bathrooms

New Hangar - hoping to get a "Jet Tenant." They also have a long list of people wanting to store their small planes at the facility.

Renovate and Revise the Turf Strip that runs perpendicular to the paved strip - the grass strip is used for small planes that use the facility.

A New entry off of Thomas Road - with a new roadway named "Flight Line Drive"

In 4-5 years they hope to build a Hangar Cafe that airport users and local community members can use
