Program

Tom Carter from the Gleaners Kitchen has been a volunteer with the program for 9 years. In June 2022 it will be 35 years since the Kitchen started.

Due to COVID restrictions they are serving bagged lunches. The number of people going through the food line is less now, but many of the attendees are picking up for themselves and others; so the number of people being serviced is higher than prior to the pandemic. The kitchen receives food donations from Foodlink, community donations, and area groups.

They put out canned goods, fruits and vegetables, etc. and each person can fill a “banana box” before they leave. The program will continue with bagged lunches for the next 6 months – dependent on spread of COVID.

The program is always looking for donations of canned goods, boxes of rice, cake mixes, etc.
