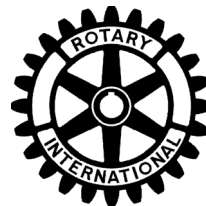

Program: Name: 1st Amendment, 1st Vote: Paul Harvey introduced **Melina Carnicelli**, CEO and founder, **Tony Barbaro**, Treasurer.

1st Amendment, 1st Vote provides non-partisan, civic engagement and leadership opportunities for high school teen girls. It's a pathway for young women willing to imagine themselves in elected office or government related positions. As a result, they expect to achieve gender parity in US elected offices at all levels.

Melina gave us an overview of this pathway to government leadership for teen girls. The girls get to imagine themselves as government leaders, engage in focused discussions with women who are in elected positions; learn about Amendment 1 & 19 of the US Constitution; become familiar with proposed equal rights amendment to the Constitution; learn how to register and vote; articulate a vision for gender parity in local, state and national elective offices; learn how to conduct a campaign; serve as change-makers in their home schools for a needed project; do a campaign simulation for a local office. Invite local and state leaders.
