Today's Program: LifeVac – presented by **Kim Tenreiro**

Choking is the 4th leading cause of accidental death causing nearly 5000 deaths every year, 65% of which are infants and small children. Current recommendations call for 5 back blows. If unsuccessful, 5 abdominal thrusts (AT's) to follow. AT's can be only 50%-70% effective, can cause rib injury, and are not suitable in some situations. LifeVac is an FDA approved device the requires no special training to use and is reputed to be nearly 100% effective. Retail price is \$69.99 but in bulk price reduces to \$47.99. Our club is considering a project to purchase of units to deploy in restaurants, schools, ARC's and to offer sale to club members and general public. Many other potential deployment sites are also possible. The exact logistics of administering this project are still in development.
