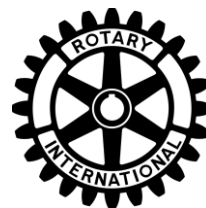

**Program:** Anna Rothstein, MD of the local Eye Care Center presented a program on oculoplastic, reconstructive & cosmetic surgery that she performs. Many of the surgeries are performed in their office based surgery suite. Causes for droopy upper eye lid surgery include droopy upper lids and excess skin. Causes for lower lid surgery include eyelids turning inward or outward and also having "bags" under the eyes. Patient experiences for such surgeries include:~outpatient surgery & going home same day, ~IV or oral sedation,~swelling & bruising with recovery in about 2 weeks,~icing of the site at home,~no heavy lifting or heavy physical activity,~they work with your health insurance to get pre-approval. Their office also helps patients with Benign Eyelid lesions such as styes, skin tags, & cysts. Malignant eyelid lesions such as basal cell and squamous cell carcinoma are coordinated with outside medical doctors and Dr. Rothstein then does the reconstructive surgery after recovery from the surgery. Their office offers Botox treatments for glabellar folds, forehead lines, & crow's feet. These treatments last about 3 months before clients have to have another treatment. They also offer Dermal Fillers which are gel injections that last from 6 to 18 months before needing another treatment. Both the Botox and Dermal Filler treatments are done right at their office.
