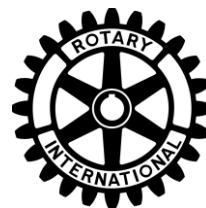

Program: Our regularly scheduled program about Big Brothers and Big Sisters cancelled, so **PDG Janet Tenreiro** presented a short program on **The Rotary Foundation Basics**. The Foundation is the charitable arm of Rotary International and is a registered 501c3, which has been awarded a 4 star rating from Charity Navigator for the last 16 years. The Foundation supports our Global grants and district grants through donations to The Annual Share Fund. PolioPlus donations get matched 2 to 1 by the Gates Foundation, and we're very close! The easiest way to donate is to sign in to My.Rotary.org and either register if you don't

already have an account, or sign in if you do. Once you are signed in, click on the Donate button, and you will get several options. You can choose to donate to Featured Causes (Annual Share, PolioPlus, World Fund, Disaster Relief, or Brazil Flood Disaster); or to one of the seven Areas of Focus; or to a specific global grant, or to the Endowment Fund. Once you have chosen where you want your donation to go, you choose your country, currency, one-time or recurring donation, the amount, and how you would like to pay. It makes it very easy to set up a \$10.00 a month payment, and very likely you won't miss it! **Tom Rogers** chipped in at the end to explain how you can follow your donation history and transactions.

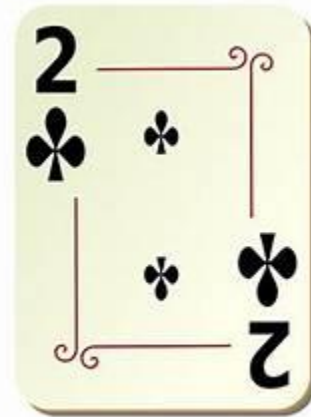
