Today's Program: Doug Merrill and Lynn Klotz from the Canandaigua Lake Watershed Association.

Doug and Lynn presented a terrific overview of our lake, its threats, and its beauty, along with some practical suggestions for what we can do to protect and restore our precious resource.

Threats include: **Harmful Algae Blooms** – mostly caused by nutrients (fertilizers, manure, improperly functioning septic systems). Stay out of the water, and don't fish or drink untreated water – and keep your pets out, too!

Terrestrial Invasive species present another threat, so keep your eyes open for Gypsy Moths, Hemlock Woolly Adelgid, Jumping Worms, Spotted Lanternfly, and Oak Wilt. The Spotted Lanternfly loves grape vines and fruit orchards. They can devastate a vineyard in a matter of just a few years. When the bugs kill the trees on our slopes above the lakes, silt and detritus ends up in the lake. Identify, Report, and Manage.

Aquatic Invasive Species can reproduce rapidly and crowd out native fish and plants. A few species of concern are the round goby fish, hydrilla plant, water lettuce, and zebra and quagga mussels. Boaters can help by cleaning, draining, and drying their boats and trailers both before entering the water, and upon leaving it.
